THE GOLD COURSE

Back in 1963, while inspecting the construction of Colonial Williamsburg's Golden Horseshoe Gold Course, architect Robert Trent Jones Sr. said the course was "the equal of Augusta National and one that will not take second place to any in the world."

Besides presenting a challenge to golfers at all levels, the Gold is one of the country's most beautiful courses, embraced by mature woodlands and awarded status as an Audubon Sanctuary. Or as Jones himself put it way back when, "the Gold Course is a natural arboretum upon which a great golf course has been built."

The Gold remains an enduring example of traditional golf architecture, featuring pinched, and often sloped, landing areas as well as long forced carries to deceiving pin placements on small greens. At 6,817 yards from the tips and with a par of 71, the Gold requires precision as well as power. With the recent restoration completed in 2017 by Rees Jones, the pure conditions now enhance the masterful layout.

It is included on Golf Magazine's "Top 100 You Can Play" list of public-access courses, and is one of the Top Six Robert Trent Jones Sr. courses named by Golf Digest, joining the likes of Ireland's Ballybunion, Spain's Valderrama, and California's Spyglass Hill. Yes, it is that good. And that special.

Opened in 1991, Rees Jones drew inspiration from his father Robert Trent Jones Sr.'s iconic Gold Course to create the acclaimed Green Course in Colonial Williamsburg. Carved from the same beautiful parkland terrain, the Green Course is longer than Gold but also more forgiving—creating an entertaining challenge for golfers of every skill level.
