<u>VSB Council</u>, the Virginia State Bar's governing body, will hold its annual elections by electronic ballot in April 2024 for terms beginning July 1. Make sure your contact information is current before March 15 to ensure that you are eligible to run and to vote in your circuit – and that you receive the ballot.



Supreme Court of Virginia Approves LEO 1900; Amends Two Rules On January 4, 2024, the Supreme Court of Virginia approved LEO 1900 effective immediately, and amended Rules 8.4 and 1A:8 effective March 4, 2024.
